

## COLT CCO 45 ACP, ABOUT \$1250 GUN TESTS GRADE: B

The Colt CCO was the first gun to mate the Commander-length slide to the Officer's Model frame. This gave a clean design that, with its aluminum-alloy frame, made this smaller 1911 easy to pack all day. The gun features Ahrends Tactical wood grips and some engraving.

The Colt CCO is significantly smaller and a good deal lighter than the full-size 1911, shown behind the CCO. The CCO did not have an ambidextrous safety. The Videki trigger had an excellent pull of 4.5 pounds. We liked this gun a lot.

Some of the innards of the Colt were treated with Robar's NP<sub>3</sub> process. These include the outside of the barrel, the bushing, magazine, and spring guides. No tools were needed for takedown.
