Remington 597 SS No. 26565 22 LR, \$283	May 2008	Grade B+: Moderate price. Robust construction and good materials. Blued is \$188, and we might pick that instead.
Ruger 10-22 K10/2T 22 LR, \$495	October 2007	Grade B+: Accurate. Good, but not great, trigger. Excellent barrel. Didn't like difficult magazine extraction.
Armscor AK 22, 22LR, \$220	April 2006	Grade B+ (Buy It): Intimidating appearance. A good, solid rimfire. AK47 owners might upgrade this to Grade A .
Clark 10/17 Model RDSS-1022-17 17 HMR, \$960	October 2004	Grade B+ (Buy It): It was clean, looked good, and had honest workmanship. Excellent accuracy.
Henry U.S. Survival Rifle 22 LR, \$165	March 2003	Grade B+ (Buy It): Incredibly light. Put a decent trigger into it and stick it in your backpack.
Marlin 70PSS Papoose 22 LR, \$318	April 2006	Grade B (Buy It): Just right for the small beginner, but portability is its greatest appeal.
Ruger 10/22 Camo Model 1163LZ 22 LR, \$526	May 2008	Grade C: The laser might solve some problems for those with questionable vision. Our only objection was the cost.
Briley 17 HMR Sporter, \$1100	October 2004	Grade C (Conditional Buy): Failures to fire. Stock looked great, and overall workmanship seemed to be first-rate.
