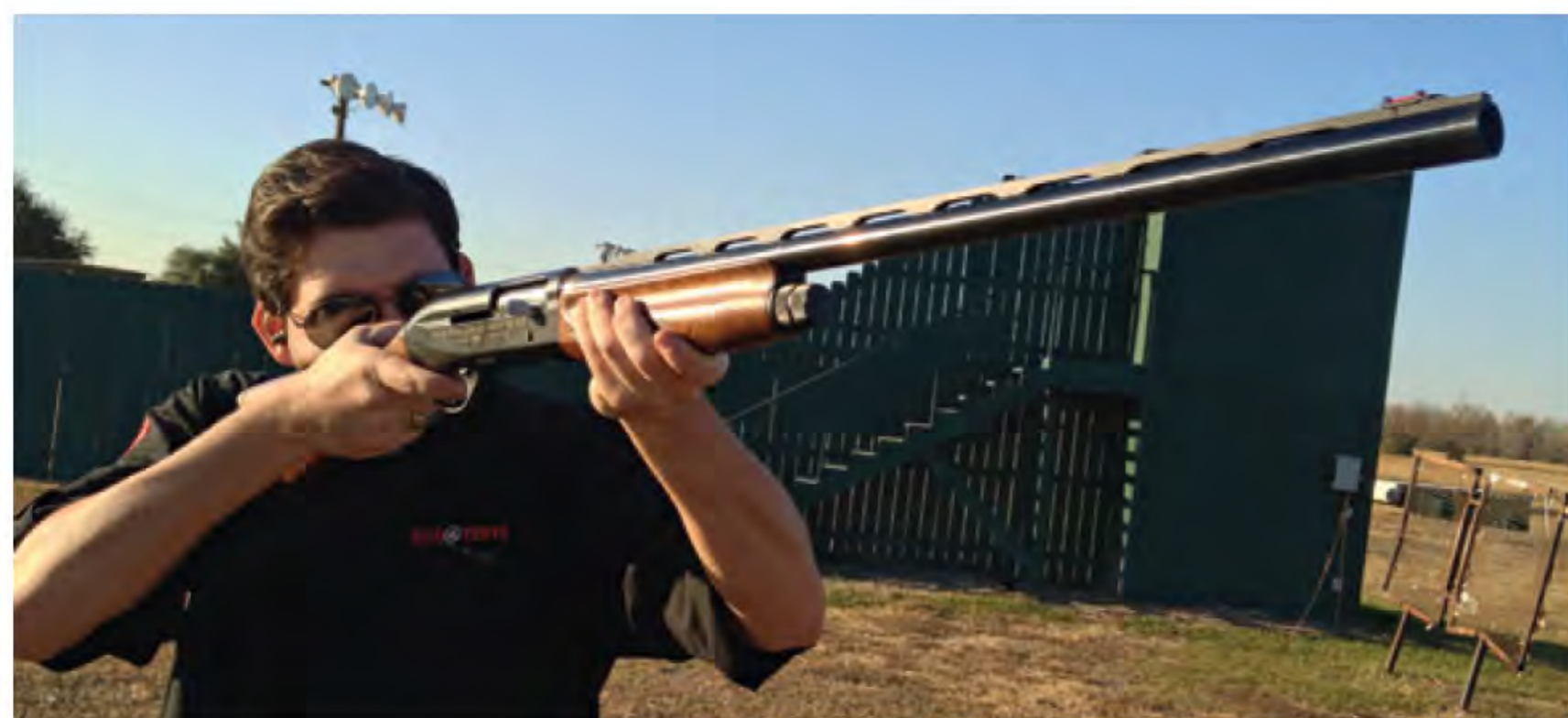


BENELLI ULTRALIGHT NO.10802 12 GAUGE, \$1649 **GUN TESTS GRADE: A (OUR PICK)**

This one is the easy winner as a field gun or as an all-round pick.



Our initial forays with the Ultralight had us swinging too far in front of targets — but no worries, we adjusted to the lighter weight and got our timing back.



The red bar front sight was easy to see against any sky conditions. It sat atop a carbon-fiber rib that was scored to reduce glare. The flush-fit choke tubes weren't as handy as the competition extended chokes on the Remington.



Benelli used an aluminum alloy in the receiver to save weight, among other strategies. Because this shotgun was 2 pounds lighter than the 1100 and its steel receiver, we'd say they succeeded.



Cosmetics are always in the eye of the beholder. We thought the Remington had the better forend wood, but this was nice, too.
