To collect accuracy data, we fired five-shot groups from a sandbag rest. Distance: 25 yards. We recorded velocities using an Oehler 35P chronograph, with the sky screens set 3 feet from the muzzle.

We think the front sight of the Marvic Gold offered the best visual definition to the shooter. Note the absence of a muzzle brake.
