

# REMINGTON MODEL 8 SELF LOADING 35 REMINGTON, \$650

## GUN TESTS GRADE: B+

The Remington handles well, is light enough, and reliable. This is a first-class brush gun with many good features. The self-loading action and powerful modern cartridge are big advantages.

To load the rifle, lock the bolt to the rear and insert five rounds into the magazine using a stripper clip.



The Remington takes down by removing a captive screw that holds the forend to the rifle. Under the forend is a permanently attached lever (arrow). Turn this lever clockwise and the barrel separates from the receiver and breaks down into two approximately equal sections.



The Remington Model 8 was a John Browning design, and the recoil action is similar to that of the original Browning automatic shotgun.

Our gun had the popular peep-sight option. Once raised, this sight locks in place. The Remington is still a viable hunting rifle capable of taking game appropriate to the 35 Remington cartridge, and that is a lot of pretty big game. The Remington and its Browning-designed recoil action and popular, readily available cartridge win out over the Winchester.
