Kel-Tec P32PK, \$361 GUN TESTS GRADE: A-

If we chose the P32PK as a backup gun, our recommendation would be that it be paired with a primary gun that also demanded that the shooter manipulate a long trigger stroke. For example, we think any of the double-action-only pistols tested in our April

2008 issue would make an ideal battery mate to the Kel-Tec P32 series pistol.



Walther USA PPK .32ACP, VAH32002 \$573 GUN TESTS GRADE: A-

The PPK is a special pistol in terms of history and design that today's shooter might overlook. We think the quality of workmanship justified its price. We were amazed at how quickly we could empty its seven-round magazines, and how much fun that was.



Taurus Millennium Pro PT132SSP, 1-132039P, \$436 GUN TESTS GRADE: F

Given its wide grip and high capacity, we'd think of this pistol as being a small gun for primary carry rather than as a backup. To this end, we think this platform would be more reliable and effective chambered for a larger caliber.

Taurus is one of the few manufacturers that still supplies a written warranty that reads Lifetime Guarantee. Perhaps its cycling problem could be solved with warranty work, but for us, that the gun stuttered made us wary of it, especially in light that we had two other solid choices.
