A fine shooting tool that handled well and functioned without flaw, the price tag was the chief obstacle in our grade for the Super Sport. We believe that the extra \$200 to \$300 could be better spent on more ammunition, unless the looks of the Super Sport are a deciding factor in your purchase.

Benelli Cordoba No. 10650 20 Gauge, \$1500 GUN TESTS GRADE: B+



The Cordoba is obviously designed for heavy use and more than fulfills all the needs of both the competition shooter and the bird hunter. A solid and smooth shooting tool, the Cordoba is a fine choice for anyone's firearm collection, with the price tag as the only downside in this match up.

Beretta AL391 Urika No. J391122 20 Gauge, \$1350 GUN TESTS GRADE: A-



Traditional looks and feel, plus the lower sticker price, gave the Beretta the winning edge in this matchup. Like both of the Benelli shotguns, the performance and handling ability of the Beretta was exceptional in our field tests. The only downside came when it was time to clean the Beretta—it is harder to put back together and gets dirty easier than the Benelli shotguns. If you mind the cleaning time, either of the Benelli's might be a better choice for you.
