Gun Tests grade: B+

The Stag Arms SA6 shot great on the bench and was the favorite gun of several testers, especially those used to bolt actions. On the negative side of the ledger: The ergo grip was undersized for off-hand shooting, and it was very front heavy. We'd like to see a vented forend to reduce the weight and a more substantial stock, such as the PRS.
