The heaviest gas gun tested, the Beretta Urika 2 was the most reliable shotgun. Though it has an over-complicated design in our view, this example proved reliable with no cleaning whatsoever for more than thousand rounds of ammo. It was by far the best-looking shotgun of the test, with the best wood and tasteful engraving. For a high-volume mixture of clays and stationary wing-shooting, the Urika excels. For a lightweight field gun, you might look elsewhere.
