GUN NAME	ISSUE	GRADE & COMMENTS
Walther P22 22 LR No. WAP22003, \$301	Feb 2006	Grade A: We liked this little .22 pistol. Many five-shot groups were around an inch at 15 yards.
Beretta U22 NEOS 22 LR, \$225	Jan. 2003	Grade A: The NEOS is one of the few guns you might buy just to look at. Rakish style may not be for you.
Browning Buck Mark FLD Plus Rosewood UDX 22LR, \$417	Jan. 2007	Grade A: Simple maintenance, great looks and accurate, this is a gun that made us want to go to shooting.
Smith & Wesson Model 41 22 LR, \$500 to \$650 used	July 2000	Grade A: There are great values out there on used Model 41s. If you can find one in good shape, Buy It.
Ruger Competition Target 22 LR, \$441	July 2000	Grade A: It was extremely accurate with the Federal target fodder.
Walther P22 22 LR, \$312	Jan. 2003	Grade B+: The P22 can be shot exclusively in single action or used effectively as a trainer.
Smith & Wesson 22A-1 22 LR, \$260	Jan. 2003	Grade B+: The 22A-1's trigger and sights gave us the most confidence. Accurate, the fastest shooter
Whitney Wolverine 22 LR, \$280	May 2006	Grade B+: The gun worked very well, even in extreme cold with light target ammo. The groups were excellent.
Walther PP Sport 22 LR, about \$1100	Feb 2006	Grade B+: The rare old PP Sport was a mighty accurate, thoroughly reliable, and highly desirable pistol.
Smith & Wesson 22A-1 22 LR 107431, \$427	Feb 2007	Grade B-: Easy gun to shoot accurately and maintain, but the safety was too difficult to operate, in our view.
Ruger 22/45 Mark III 22 LR (KP512MKIII), \$398	Jan 2007	Grade C: Overly complex take down/reassembly procedure might ultimately keep this gun in the closet.
Walther P22 No. WAP22005 22 LR, \$301	Feb 2006	Grade C: At first we really liked this version with its 5-inch barrel and its false brake, but our opinion changed.
