GUN TESTS GRADE: B-

The Ruger No. 1 International is the least traditional Mannlicher-style rifle in the test, but it still had plenty of the type's attributes. The International is basically a standard No. 1 with shortened barrel and full-length stock. It would be a dream to use in a tree stand or ground blind.

The loose rear sight was a disappointment.

Right and above: Press the trigger-guard lever down (arrow) to drop the stainless-steel block in the action and load the rifle. Rounds easily slid into the chamber, especially with the muzzle pointed to the ground.



Above: The Ruger's buttstock wood had more figuring than the others, and the checkering was crisp and neat. The soft recoil pad mated nicely to the stock.



Left: The Ruger's front sight included a tiny gold bead. The barrel free floated along the forearm, though the steel end cap came into contact with the end of the barrel.

Right: Ruger's proprietary quarter rib and rings allow easy mounting of a scope (arrow). The rear sight was also mounted on the rib. It folded down to accommodate large scope lenses.
