Lanber 2097 Sporting Lux 12 Gauge, \$1099

GUN TESTS GRADE: A-

Overall value should convince many buyers to choose a new-in-box Lanber over a used edition of a higher priced brand. The quality of the Moroccan walnut should lend itself well to the kind of modifications that shotgunners often require. This is a low-priced quality shotgun that most shooters will not grow out of quickly.

Remington SPR310S 12 Gauge, \$770

GUN TESTS GRADE: B

An appealing shotgun with room for improvement. We had to downgrade it for the wood-tipped heel and harsh-operating auto safety, which will cost extra to modify.

Mossberg Onyx Reserve Sporting 12 Gauge, \$756

GUN TESTS GRADE: B+

The Mossberg didn't have any major flaws. The Onyx receiver looked classy even if its wood was nothing special. Fit was surprisingly neutral for a variety of shooters, so custom stock fitting may or may not be necessary. The key to its rating is that it fulfills its promises of function at a very low price.
