Left: In case you were wondering, the Brush Popper is for cowboys, as the leather buttstock sheath makes clear. The leather cover was a necessary piece of kit because the buttplate was very sharp, our testers found.



Left: The Popper had two very large advantages over the other guns. One was its smooth shorter-stroke lever, and the other was the excellent checkering on the straight grip.



Left: The 1873 design and receiver shape is a proven and recognizable badge of the Old West. Metal-to-wood fit at the joints was tight, but not always flush. Minor point for our team.



Left: Out front, the Popper's forend was rock-solid tight, just like the Henry's.



Above: The semi-buckhorn rear sight rode in a driftable mount that supplied corrections, if needed. Below: The Marble front brass bead was easy to read.
