## BROWNING BPS STALKER NO. 012212304 12 GA., \$700

The heaviest model of the three, the BPS handled well and performed flawlessly in our tests. Its heft and longer length of pull may be a little harder to handle for shooters of smaller stature, but the reduction in felt recoil is a good counterpoint to its size. This was the highest-priced model in the test, but we did not consider the extra cost to be a deal killer.



As noted in the review, the Browning featured bottomejection and loading that allows for ambidextrous use. Another plus to bottom-ejection is that spent hulls land near the shooter's feet, rather that sail off to the side — good for reloaders and hunters in a blind that don't want to ding empty shells off their companions.



We have wondered why more shotgun manufactures do not offer a top-tang safety that is very easily operated by shooters, even with gloved hands. This is a very nice touch on this model.
