## GUN TESTS GRADE: A-

The Ruger had excellent sights, and with the slightly larger grip, it was easier to shoot well. Loading and unloading were tedious.

The sight picture on the Ruger was excellent, plus it allowed a user to adjust the sights; the Heritage had fixed sights.



Ruger countersunk each chamber in the Single-Six's cylinder (left); Heritage countersunk the entire surface of the cylinder rear (right), leaving a ridge.

The grooved Ruger base pin (right) was easier to grasp than the finely knurled Heritage base pin (left).



The Single-Six has a transfer bar to block the hammer from hitting the firing pin. Both SA triggers were crisp and light.
