This Winchester looks similar to the Chiappa lever action we tested last year, with its short and sharp stock, basic furniture, and near-black bluing. Too little for the money, we think.



If you want the dysfunctionality of an original design, here it is. The slick, curved metal buttplate was supposed to increase shooter control of the rifle, but ours didn't. And the sharp point at the toe was uncomfortable. **Our Cowboy Action consultant** said cutting the curvature off the butt and slipping on a leather buttpad would be one of the first things he did to it.



Overall flt and finish were fine. The metal-to-wood seams were tight, and the metalwork itself was smooth and consistent.



Here's the adjustable semibuckhorn rear sight. The tang was drilled and tapped.
